create this orange-tinged Barolo. While there is a firm core of red and black cherry fruit, it is much more defined by sanguine, non-fruit edge. Rusted iron and savory,

herbal spice sing through, like a well-seasoned red sauce, with punchy tannins.

"This is a wine I highly recommend especially for those who can't resist the beautiful taste of Nebbiolo in a more informal dining scenario (like around the kitchen table with family and friends). The 2012 Barolo Lecinqueviane sees fruit sourced from five vineyard sites, and all that mixing and matching gives the winemakers more flexibility for achieving quality. For this reason, Lecinquevigne has shown impressive quality over the years. The wine is redolent of wild berry, cola, licorice and soft spice. Damilano has been a Barolo protagonist for many years. Even if you are already familiar with its wines, this estate merits a longer look. I have been impressed by the work underway here and notice tangible tweaks to the winemaking style that represent a constant stream of improvements building over the past five years or so. For example, the Damilano 2012 Barolo Cannubi stands out among its peers. This is a difficult feat considering the competitive nature of this super-celebrated single vineyard. Among so many excellent producers that farm here, Damiliano's Cannubi holds its own, especially in the challenging 2012 vintage. More interesting, however, is the special anniversary magnum of Cannubi from the 2008 vintage and bottled today as a limited-production Riserva. Congratulations."

The vines are 30 to 50 years old and you can almost sense them regulating lower yields and squeezing out only the finest juiciest nebbiolo fruit into the grapes. Don't be fooled by its pale colour but rather revel in its earthy, violet, wild cherry nose. The palate is similar with fleshy, juicy red fruits seldom encountered in young nebbiolo -especially from what many would describe as a difficult vintage. You can cellar this another three to five years or serve now with mushrooms, grilled beef or roasted chicken. Good value and worth stocking up. A great bottle for restaurants."

It's great to see Damilano gradually moving to a style that gives more importance to terroir than winemaking. With those holdings, however, comes a responsibility to make wines that respect the quality and qualities of those sites. Floral, spiced notes are woven throughout. This shows beautiful persistence on the palate and a long, refined finish. Anticipated maturity: 2011-2018. Cerequio. Brunate. Cannubi. These are the Italian equivalents of Musigny, Bonnes Mares and Chambertin; in other words, among the most precious vineyards anywhere in the world. Consulting oenologist Giuseppe Caviola is a virtual guarantee that the Damilano wines will always be well-made, but when will they become truly distinctive and worthy of their origins? That is the question that still needs to be answered. Drink 2011-2018."
