Peachy Canyon is a family owned and operated winery in beautiful Paso Robles on California's Central Coast, near Hearst Castle and Big Sur.

Founded by Doug and Nancy Beckett in 1988, Peachy Canyon has long been praised as a producer of award-winning California wines that exemplify respect for terroir and dedicated winemaking.

Zinfandel has long been Peachy Canyon's flagship varietal—oftentimes with multiple vineyard designates in production. These red Zinfandels range from elegant and restrained to fruit forward, each an exemplary call to its own terroir. With these exemplary Zins Peachy Canyon has been instrumental in establishing Paso Robles' reputation as a key California wine region.

Peachy Canyon has been ranked in the top 100 wines in the world by Wine Spectator magazine, and its many wines have been ranked with 90-point-plus scores, often for multiple vintages. Today a limited selection of choice Peachy Canyon wines are available in distribution in the US, Canada, UK, Japan, Korea, and China, with the most limited-allocation, low production wines available direct from the winery in the US.

One of their 2 son's, Josh Beckett, is now co-owner & the winemaker.

Harvest	This fruit was harvested over a period of several weeks to attain ideal ripeness, picked in the early hours of the morning, and destemmed into fermenters. 25.5 brix at harvest.		
Vinification/ Maturation	This fruit was harvested over a period of several weeks to attain ideal ripeness, picked in the early hours of the morning and destemmed into fermenters. During ferment the juice was pumped over twice a day, and gently pressed after two weeks where it aged for fourteen months on French and American oak.		
Tasting Notes	A rich and fruity nose opens with black cherry, blackberry, nutmeg, and vanilla, leading into toffee, cigar, and cherrywood. On the palate the wine is round and sumptuous, with notes of cherry, clove, and orange oil. This Incredible Red meets and exceeds the promise in its name.

Cellaring	This wine is well balanced making it an excellent wine to enjoy by itself or to pair with an assortment of different foods.

Vintage	The 2017 growing season yielded fully mature fruit that produced rich, complex wines, with an impressive depth of flavor.
Harvest	August 20, 2017-September 28, 2017. Brix at harvest 24.5.
Vinification/ Maturation	This Cirque du Vin was fermented in stainless steel tanks and pressed directly to a blend of French, Hungarian, and American oak barrels for a minimum of 18 months.
Tasting Notes	Deep garnet & brick in color. Clear margin. Warm and smooth. Caramel, raspberry, black currant, eucalyptus nose. Tart black cherry, raspberry preserves, and black currant.
Serve with	It makes a great match for pork, grilled meats, and barbecue of all kinds. Supremely drinkable and easy-going.

Vintage	The 2017 growing season yielded fully mature fruit that produced rich, complex wines, with an impressive depth of flavor.
Harvest	Hand-picked into half ton bins in the early morning hours so that the grapes were at their coldest. October 11, 2017. 25.3 Brix at harvest.
Vinification/ Maturation	The fruit for this Petite Sirah was sourced from multiple vineyards on the west side of Paso Robles. Picked as they reached optimal ripeness, the grapes were hand-harvested and carefully destemmed. The resulting musts were fermented to dryness and softly pressed before being aged for 18 months in a combination of 30% new French, Hungarian and American Oak barriques and puncheons.
Tasting Notes	Bright magenta in color. Smells of coffee grounds, cedar, leather, tar and asphalt after a fresh rain. Blackberries, blueberries, black cherries, and currants compete with hints of orange peel, anise, plum, red-delicious apples, and vanilla bean. Acid driven, this wine has a lengthy, spicy finish that shows generous amounts of nutmeg and cinnamon.
Serve with	The panel suggested that this fruit bomb would pair well with Kerrygold Dubliner cheese.

Vinification/ Maturation	The fruit for this Zinfandel was sourced from multiple vineyards on the west side of Paso Robles. Picked as they reached optimal ripeness, the grapes were hand harvested and carefully destemmed. The resulting musts were fermented to dryness and softly pressed before being aged for 18 months in a combination of 30% new French, Hungarian, and American oak barriques and puncheons.		
Tasting Notes	Ever our flagship Zinfandel, this charming wine opens with aromas of rhubarb, saw dust, and allspice. Plum, black cherry, and boysenberry marry notes of leather, tobacco, cassis, and menthol on the palate for a slightly dry finish. Pale garnet, bordering on brick. Extremely balanced, with light grainy tannins, nice length and a full body. A spicy nose of bay leaves, rose petals, white pepper, coriander and anise opens up to a mouth full of raspberry brambles and strawberry-rhubarb pie. Accented with hints of ripe stone fruit, red currants, and vanilla.		
Serve with	Food friendly and elegant. Roast Duck with Mushroom Cream Sauce, Bone-in Ribeye Steak With A White Pepper Demi-Glaze Sauce, Beef Stew
