Sustainability The vineyard is farmed using only 100% organic and biodynamic techniques. Haut

Bergey earned their certification for being organic in 2018.

General Info In the 15th century the "Seigneur de la Louvière" and the "Seigneur d'Olivier" got to

work on the reparcelling of agricultural land and so was born" La maison noble de Pontey" today named Chateau Haut-Bergey. In 1700 Sir Jean-François de Cresse, a member of parliament of Bordeaux, took it over and used it as his permanent

residence.

By 1772 the estate stretched over 100 hectares of vineyard. A hundred years later,

though the vineyard was abandoned and in 1850 a splendid castle was

reconstructed, becoming a leisure residence. It was in the middle of the last century $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right) \left($

the castle returned to the wine growing roots of the past.

In March 1991 Sylviane Garcin-Cathiard acquired Chateau Haut-Bergey.

Granddaughter of a wine merchant and a successful businesswoman, her approach

has always been that of a connoisseur appreciating great wine.

It was love at first sight and the promising charm of Chateau Haut-Bergey encouraged her into a large renovation project whilst respecting the former

traditions. Commitment to quality is her main principle.

Vintage The climatic conditions of this vintage were not obvious. Heavy rains in the spring

and a severe drought this summer characterize 2020 at Château Haut-Bergey. The effects of the summer heat were offset by the clay soil which served as a water

reserve. The maturity reached by the grapes is however qualitative.

Vineyards The Chateau Haut-Bergey vineyard covers 70 hectares, out of which 42 hectares of

vines are in production and planted in sandy-gravelly soils upon a clay subsoil. The vineyard is certified for organic and biodynamic viticulture, practicing grassing between the rows of vines, earthing, and unearthing by foot. The vineyard and wines of Chateau Haut-Bergey are Ecocert and Demeter certified. The 2020

Chateau Haut-Bergey red comes from a 25-hectare vineyard.

Harvest The grapes are transported in small boxes of 20 kg in order to avoid them being squeezed or oxidation.

The 2020 yield was just 18 hl/ha.

Winemaking The grapes, harvested manually, were subject to successive sorting. The vinification of the 2020 Chateau Haut-

Bergey red was carried out in tapered stainless-steel vats, favoring gentle extraction. Aging lasted 16 months in

3000-liter casks and 300-liter barrels.

Tasting Notes The 2020 vintage is characterized by its power and its fresh and dense fruit. Fine and precise tannins announce

a great aging capability. Delicate, dark fruity nose, shows blackberries, prunes, herbs, cinnamon. Soft on the palate, round, almost plump, then grabs, the tannins mark, have a slightly drying effect, give the fruit a tight

corset, in the middle palate with an aromatic sag. Short, slightly drying finish. 2024-2035.

Serve with Chateau Haut Bergey is best served at 15.5 degrees Celsius, 60 degrees Fahrenheit. The cool, almost cellar

temperature gives the wine more freshness and lift. The red wine of Chateau Haut Bergey is best served with all types of classic meat dishes, veal, pork, beef, lamb, duck, game, roast chicken, roasted, braised, and grilled

dishes.

"Full bottle just 1,260 g. Demeter certified. Cask sample taken 2 April. 40% Merlot, 40% Cabernet Sauvignon, 13% Cabernet Franc, 6% Petit Verdot, 1% Malbec. The average yield was just 18 hl/ha. Aged 16 months in 300-litre barrels and a 3,000-litre wooden tun. Blackish, concentrated crimson. High-toned nose suggests some subtlety. Lovely supple palate entry — very beguiling and distinctive. Lots of freshness and terroir expression here. The tannins are so ripe you hardly notice them; they creep up on you only at the end. This definitely treads its own path and delivers what one might call new bordeaux with a fan of subtle flavours at the end. Chapeau."
