General Info Located six kilometres east of St Emilion, the history of the nine-hectare Chateau

Faugères can be traced back to at least 1823, when it came into the possession of the Guisez family. There it stayed until very recently, having been inherited in 1987 by Pierre-Bernard Guisez – aka Péby – and his wife Corrine, who together produced wines from the St Emilion and Cotes de Castillon appellations, eventually with assistance from consultant Michel Rolland.

When Péby died aged just 52, Corrine and the couple's daughters kept the estate going, even creating a super-cuvee in his honour: Péby-Faugères, which is regarded by many more highly than the estate's Grand Vin.

In 2005, the family sold the estate to Swiss businessman Silvio Denz, who had already established a history in vineyard investment, and under his supervision in 2009 the estate underwent a complete renovation, making it one of the most architecturally stunning, state-of-the-art winemaking facilities in the Right Bank. This, coupled with the estate's exceptional clay and limestone soil, helped propel Chateau Faugères to new heights, and in 2012 the estate earned Grand Cru Classe classification.

Vintage 2018 will be remembered as a year of challenges, which began with turbulent

conditions due to strong climatic contrasts. After the intense rainfall of the first six months of the year, a strong mildew pressure threatened the vineyard. Due to the conversion of Chateau Péby-Faugères to organic viticulture, a process which began in 2017, the property's technical teams had to use all their energy and know-how to enable the vine to give the best of itself. A constant vigilance in the vineyard and close attention paid to each plot ensured a dazzling 2018 vintage for Chateau Péby-

Faugères.

Vineyards Péby-Faugères is a blend of the wines from Chateau Faugères' best plots of land. The

Chateau Faugères estate covers 9 hectares, located in Saint Emilion on clay-limestone

soils. The vines are 100% Merlot and are on average 40 years old.

Harvest Dates unknown

Vinification/ Traditional viticulture methods are used, such as green harvesting, leaf pruning and Maturation manual picking. When selecting the grapes, two sorting tables are used to ensure the

best possible quality. Maturation is conducted over 18 months in 100% new French

oak barrels.

Tasting Notes Made from 100% Merlot, the Chateau Péby-Faugères 2018 offers a pure expression

of the great terroirs of Saint-Emilion. The vintage is aged for 18 months in French oak barrels (100% new). Unanimously acclaimed by international critics, the Chateau Péby-Faugères 2018 offers a magnificent definition of fruit, with great opulence and concentration. Savory and voluptuous, the palate presents juicy fruit, structured by ripe and perfectly integrated tannins. The minerality of the Saint-Emilion limestone terroirs appears with great nobility and intensity, while the development of the palate stretches forth into a persistent finish. A beautiful reference from Saint-

Emilion in an exceptional vintage for Bordeaux.

Serve with Chateau Péby-Faugères is best paired with all types of classic meat dishes, veal, pork,

beef, lamb, duck, game, roast chicken, roasted, braised, and grilled dishes. Chateau Péby-Faugères is also good when matched with Asian dishes, rich fish courses like

tuna, mushrooms, and pasta.



"Made of 100% Merlot, the 2018 Péby-Faugères has a deep garnet-purple color and bombastic scents of plum preserves, baked black cherries, cedar chest and blueberry pie with an undercurrent of menthol, black olives, charcuterie and Indian spice, plus a waft of oolong tea. The seductively rich, full-bodied palate (15.5% alcohol) delivers mouth-coating black fruit preserves with a velvety texture and just enough freshness, finishing long and spicy yet with a touch of oak poking through. It will need a good 5 years in cellar for the oak to settle in, then drink it over the next 20 years or more."

Full-bodied, taut and muscular, the palate has a rock-solid structure of firm, velvety tannins and wonderful freshness, finishing very long with loads of mineral sparks."

"The 2018 Péby-Faugères has a gorgeous bouquet of opulent boysenberry, maraschino cherry, fig and violets scents, almost identical to what I observed in barrel. Slightly granular in texture, it delivers a surfeit of black cherry and cassis toward the finish, along with fine mineralité. Unquestionably the best Péby-Faugères that I have tasted. Outstanding. "The 2018 Péby Faugères, 100% Merlot from 45-year-old vines, is fabulous. Dense, inky, and rich, with tremendous concentration, the 2018 offers superb intensity but with less of the pushed extraction that was once the norm here. Blackberry jam, spice, cloves, menthol, and licorice build in a potent, flamboyant Saint-Émilion. In 2018, Péby Faugères shows a slightly brighter and more floral profile than in the past. It will be interesting to see how the 2018 and future vintages develop, as Péby Faugères has always been distinctive. The 2018 is a terrific effort from proprietor Silvio Denz and consulting winemaker Michel Rolland. "The 2018 Château Péby-Faugères is another brilliant wine from this talented team. Based on 100% Merlot from vines in the eastern side of the appellation, it was brought up in 65% new French oak, which has been the norm for the past couple of years. (The 2015 saw 90% new oak.) Deep purple-hued, with a glorious bouquet of crème de cassis, toasted spices, violets, vanilla, and a touch of chalky minerality, this full-bodied, super-rich, incredibly sexy Saint-Emilion builds with time in the glass and has a great mid-palate and flawless balance. It has a modern style, yet I still find plenty of classic Saint-Emilion minerality. It's already beautiful, but smart money will give bottles 3-5 years and it should keep for two decades."

"I always love this cuvée, which comes from a specific parcel of very old vine Merlot on the eastern side of Saint-Émilion. The 2018 Château Péby-Faugères, which is a selection of 70% of the production and is aging in 65% new oak, reveals a deep purple color as well as a ripe, blockbuster bouquet of black fruits, smoked earth, spicy oak, and graphite. One of the ripe, powerful wines that still stays light and graceful, it's full-bodied, has ripe tannins, no hard edges, and a great finish.
