General Info Overlooking the Dordogne valley in a village two miles east of Saint-Émilion, this

pretty vineyard is planted on a clay-limestone slope thanks to which the northern and eastern parcels enjoy perfect morning sunshine. Château Puy-Blanquet was known as one of the best Saint-Émilion Grand Crus as early as the 19th century and was awarded a part of the collective gold medal bestowed upon a selection of Saint-

Émilion chateaux at the Paris Exposition of 1889.

In 2020, the vineyard was acquired by the Malet-Roquefort family, owners of Premier Grand Cru Classé Château La Gaffelière. Soils are ploughed in order to ensure deeper root systems; green harvest, leaf-cropping, and harvests are done by hand. Thermoregulated concrete tanks ensure well-controlled fermentation.

Vintage If 2021 was drier than previous years, two intense climatic episodes impacted the

vintage. The first one is the April frost which mobilized our teams for 9 nights. The second is linked to the strong episodes of rain in June, with nearly 180 mm of precipitation. The trio August / September / October was accompanied by low rainfall, allowing to harvest in optimal conditions and preserving the qualitative

potential of the vintage

Vineyards Ch. PuyBlanquet returned to the Malet Roquefort family ownership in 2020, 60 years

after its sale, before which it was held by their ancestors from 1819-1959. A single 20ha (49 acres) vineyard of limestone plateau and clay-limestone soils are planted with 75% Merlot and 15% Cabernet Franc & 10% Cabernet Sauvignon. Average vine

age is 25 years.

Harvest A respect for tradition and quality is what makes Puy-Blanquet special. Instead of following the trend, vineyard

manager Pierre Meunier has continued plowing the soils to ensure optimal maturity of the fruit. Green

harvesting, leaf cropping and harvesting are done by hand. Optical sorting.

Vinification/ The wine is vinified in traditional, cement vats. Malolactic fermentation takes place in vat. The wine is aged in a **Maturation** combination of vats and oak barrels. 80% of the production is aged in vat, 20% is aged in French oak barrels

(10% new).

Tasting Notes The 2021 Puyblanquet has a high-toned, floral bouquet with violet petals infusing the red berry fruit, hints of

mandarin in the background. The palate is medium-bodied with a pleasant sappiness on the entry, fine acidity and a minerally finish that lingers in the mouth. This is a solid effort in a tricky growing season. The wines are

fresh and generous and can be enjoyed after just two or three years of cellaring.

Serve with Chateau Puy Blanquet is best served at 15.5 degrees Celsius, 60 degrees Fahrenheit. The cool, almost cellar

temperature gives the wine more freshness and lift.

Chateau Puy Blanquet is best paired with all types of classic meat dishes, veal, pork, beef, lamb, duck, game, roast chicken, roasted, braised, and grilled dishes. Chateau Puy Blanquet is also good when matched with Asian

dishes, rich fish courses like tuna, mushrooms, and pasta.

"This very well-sited property was owned by the Malet Roquefort family of La Gaffelière until 1959; they had to sell in the downturn following the disastrous 1956 frost. But they had the opportunity to buy it back in 2020. The property sits along the limestone ridge that also houses Laroque, Pressac and Valandraud.
